[Pro 10:12 KJV] 12 Hatred stirreth up strifes: but love covereth all sins. We know the love that the Lord has for us covers our sins. [Psa 32:2 KJV] 2 Blessed [is] the man unto whom the LORD imputeth not iniquity, and in whose spirit [there is] no guile. Our sin is covered by the blood of Jesus who died on the cross and rose again and by faith in him alone our sin is not only covered but put away, our relationship with the Lord is restored and we have eternal life. This is the biblical truth for all Christians. We should not be continuing to bring up past sins of ourselves or others sins that have been forsaken and repented of.

However there is a complete different scenario for those that are still trying to hide their sin. We notice the scripture says also in whose spirit their is no guile(deception) When deception is involved we are allowing ourselves or others to believe a different story in regards to the truth. This is not the kind love that covereth sins mentioned in proverbs but a rejoicing in iniquity that stirs up hatred and strife. We know that real love [1Co 13:6 KJV] 6 Rejoiceth not in iniquity, but rejoiceth in the truth;

We remember the woman caught in adultery, she wasn't trying to hide the truth of what she had done. It was all exposed. The Lord forgave her and rebuked her accusers. Jesus told her to go and sin no more. When King David sinned and was confronted by the prophet Nathan he confessed, I have sinned. Immediately the prophet told him the Lord has forgiven your sin but that there would be consequences or chastisement for that sin. The ultimate place that God wanted king David to come to was to agree with the truth and repent.

[2Sa 24:17 KJV] 17 And David spake unto the LORD when he saw the angel that smote the people, and said, Lo, I have sinned, and I have done wickedly: but these sheep, what have they done? let thine hand, I pray thee, be against me, and against my father's house.

The attitude of King David when he sinned was not to cover it up and have everyone that may have been his friends and have benefited from his prosperity cover-up and lie for him. It was that he truly was remorseful over the destruction and misery his sin brought not only upon himself but others that looked up to him for the leadership position God had given him. He was not like his predecessor Saul that tried to have Samuel believe he was really obeying the Lord when he was not. The Lord will not justify lying or anyone who covers up lying for someone else. I'm glad that it looks like CCA is no longer trying to cover up for what Brian Broderson has lied about. [Pro 18:5 KJV] 5 [It is] not good to accept the person of the wicked, to overthrow the righteous in judgment. As long as Brian or anyone of us for that matter continues to lie, or allow something other than the truth to be brought out,

rather than forsaken and repented of, the sin/leaven problem will still remain. [Pro 28:13 KJV] 13 He that covereth his sins shall not prosper: but whoso confesseth and forsaketh [them] shall have mercy.

Pastor Chuck used to say hearts are being revealed. That's exactly what we have here. We can all learn a lesson from this. The biblical structure regarding unrepentant sin according to Jesus in Matthew 18 has not been followed. If any church bylaws are structured any other way than what Jesus said in Matthew 18 they need to be corrected and changed to follow that otherwise the problem will continue. It always has been a problem to add to or take away from Gods word and it always will be. What a blessing to just do it Gods way, repent and learn from our mistakes and walk in the light. [1Jo 1:7 KJV] 7 But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin.
